ROISIN AGNEW Writer / Producer/ Director

Roisin Agnew is an Italian Irish filmmaker and researcher based in London. She has recently worked as a games writer for PlayStation developing a new IP as part of its first writers' room.

Roisin directed THE BAN (2024) that premiered at Docs Ireland in June and wrote YARA (2023) in competition at the Galway Film Festival in July. She is currently in development with her first feature with Screen Ireland and Tailored Films (The Apprentice, Bring Them Down).

Roisin is a Visiting Lecturer at The London Film School and a PhD student at the Centre for Research Architecture, Goldsmiths. She has worked as an assistant producer on Grierson Award-nominated film THE PLAN THAT CAME FROM THE BOTTOM UP (2020) as well as worked for Irish and Italian TV (RAI, TV3, RTE) as an assistant producer. Prior to that she worked as a breaking news subeditor at The Irish Times. Roisin's fiction has appeared in The Dublin Review and MAP Journal and she has been published by The Guardian, The Irish Times, Vice, Elephant Magazine etc.

Roisin curates *Storming Heaven*, a London screening series assembled around activist film. She has won the Next Generation Artist Award in Literature (2021) from Arts Council Ireland. She is a graduate of the Edinburgh Talent Lab (2022), won JETS Berlinale (2021) and has been awarded the Stowe Story Lab Scholarship (2024).

Film (Current):

Here All Is Strange (in development) - Tailored Films - Writer Director

I'm in development with my first narrative feature to which I'm attached as a director. Tailored Films (The Apprentice, Bring Them Down) have optioned the script. It's inspired by true events involving a female suicide pact in Ireland in the year 2000.

The Ban (2024) - Erica Starling Productions, Unbecoming Productions - Director I've directed a film on Thatcher's Broadcast Ban (1988-1994) during The Troubles that saw the strange practice of hiring actors to dub those associated with the IRA. Featuring Gerry Adams, Stephen Rea, Eamon McCann, etc. It will have its Irish premiere at Docs Ireland 2024.

Yara (2023) - Little Rose Films

I devised a short film with Syrian and Palestinian refugees in the Donegal region of Ireland alongside director James Doherty, using the practice of verbatim theatre.
